SOLIDARITY BRIDGE MISSIONER APPLICATION

We invite you to complete an application for Solidarity Bridge. We are looking for medical, Spanish interpretation, and pastoral professionals who are interested in joining us for short-term (9-14 day) commitments. The following materials are required of each applicant.

- 1. Application form.
- 2. Letter of recommendation (see attached form). This may be from your current supervisor, your pastor, minister, priest, imam or rabbi, or from someone else who knows you well.
- 3. Copy of your current United States medical license (health care applicants).
- 4. Your résumé.
- 5. If a physician, a copy of your board certification and diploma.
- 6. If an interpreter, a copy of your interpreter training diploma or certification if you have them. If you are bilingual but not a trained interpreter, Solidarity Bridge will provide basic training.
- 7. A brief statement on why you want to participate in this mission. *What do you hope to receive from this experience?*
- 8. \$20 application processing fee, in the form of a check or money order. Once your application is on file, you will not be asked to pay this fee again. You may apply for future missions by just contacting our office.

Thank you for your interest and for taking the time to complete this application. We will be in touch with you as we identify the needs of the next mission and select the appropriate team members. Applicants are usually informed of their status within six weeks of application.

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MISSION APPLICATION ADDENDUM

- Each member of a mission team is accepted on an individual basis and therefore each person must go through the application process. Sometimes a physician may desire his/her physician's assistant, surgical technician or other associate to accompany him/her on a mission. We encourage missioners to recruit their associates and welcome them to apply, but we cannot guarantee placement on a team. We make every effort to recruit team members to meet the various needs of the particular mission trip.
- Mission team members sometimes inquire about a family member or friend accompanying them on the mission. At this time, we do not have a program to accommodate such arrangements in a way that would be fruitful to the companions or beneficial to the goals of the mission trip. The work of a mission trip is demanding to the point that relationships and activities outside of the team could be a distraction. For a companion to be considered for the mission, they must be able to contribute a specific skill to the mission goals. Sometimes there is a role on a mission team for a general helper. Missioners' family members and friends may apply for that role but we cannot guarantee their placement on the mission team.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Solidarity Bridge is an independent, faith-based, non-profit. We are not underwritten by budgeted funds from any church entity. We rely upon the generosity of our participants and individual donations. Each team member is asked to donate funds to the mission. While the requested donation may seem a daunting amount for some, it is also an opportunity to grow in prayer and faith, and an exercise in learning how to depend on God for provision. There is a saying that "God never sends where He does not also provide." Many who have been involved in mission work can testify to the miraculous ways God opened up the floodgates of heaven in financial blessing. We hear testimonies of surprise and delight as team members report how friends, family, and colleagues eagerly support them. Some team members may be hesitant to ask others to help with the requested donation. They may feel as though they are asking for money for themselves. But in truth, people are being asked to support the work of God by way of support of the team member. Inviting others to participate financially in the mission trip gives them the opportunity to share in the mission's fruit and blessings.

<u>We Can Help</u>: While missioners are asked to donate funds as part of their own participation in the program, no one is accepted or rejected based upon the ability or inability to provide the necessary funds. We will do our best to support individuals needing financial assistance by helping them set up a fundraising website, contacting their home parish, providing letter templates for contacting friends or family, etc. Team members who need such assistance should contact our office.

<u>Cost:</u> We count on each missioner to make a tax deductible donation of \$2,600 to Solidarity Bridge. In turn, Solidarity Bridge absorbs all of the costs of the mission including travel, lodging, food, and others such as staff time, medicines and supplies, Bolivian physician and hospital fees, etc. For every \$1 a missioner contributes, Solidarity Bridge must raise \$3 to cover the cost of the mission.

The missioner contribution may be submitted at one time or in installments. The first \$1,300 is nonrefundable and is due 30 days after being notified of acceptance on the team. Team membership is not considered final and your airline ticket cannot be purchased until this first amount is received. The remaining donation is due six weeks before our departure. If a team member has special circumstances that make these deadlines difficult, they may call the office and discuss arrangements. If a team member must withdraw due to a medical or family emergency, it may be possible to apply some or all contributions made to participation in a future mission trip for which they qualify.

<u>Contributions from Friends and Family</u>: Team members will often receive donations on their behalf. These will be "credited" toward their requested missioner donation. If designated donations are received in excess of \$2,600, the team member may request that the funds be applied toward their participation in a future mission trip (some time restrictions may apply). When receiving donations from others, checks should not be written to the team member personally. All checks must be made payable to Solidarity Bridge and the team member's name should be noted on the check. Solidarity Bridge is a 501c3 nonprofit and contributions are tax-deductible.
